#### 4. First-aid measures

#### 5. Fire-fighting measures

#### 6. Accidental release measures

Following product recovery, flush area with water.  Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.
